
Capital C (DeLand's ST 1987) just arrived at the shipyard (Shelter Island in Richmond, British Columbia, I thought you might enjoy a couple of photos of her...



She's in excellent shape. The rubber is off for painting, you can see her

original markings, and the new name just visible on the wheelhouse.....

Transport Canada made them add significant ballast to the keel to satisfy stability requirements. The owners chose to add a bow thruster, and the skipper has high praise; it's very effective he says... Capital C is owned by a company located on the northern BC island of Haida Gwai. They also own the barge that



Capital C tows. Their core business is cutting yellow cedar telephone poles and instrument spruce and supplying their market in Vancouver.



Capital C and the barge serve their transportation needs. The boat makes about 12 trips a year, each trip about 10 days. Perfect life for an ex-army tug!

I wish you the best with your plans to adopt and maintain a Deland tug. It is an ambitious project, but similar boats have been saved by efforts like yours. These tugs are capable of long life; very nice

if you can get one started on its next adventure.
