

## Tug Tales #9 December 1, 2013 A DeLand ST Tugboat Postcard

and ST 1987's Model

Tug Tales #8 revealed the existence of the orphaned Olson builder's plaque for **ST 1987**, the last of ten boats that the Olson Corp agreed to build in 1952 for the US Army. As I

pointed out, the contact was not completed, and at least according to some sources the unfinished hulls were floated to Jacksonville for completion by the Rawls Brothers. Inasmuch as **ST 1987** was the last of the ten, Rawls may have completely built the hull as well....research continues. But the boat ended up in Ft. Eustis, Virginia, at their 3<sup>rd</sup> Port Facility, and was chosen for whatever reasons as the basis for a very nice model. My guess is the real boat has a Rawls Brothers builder's plaque installed.

ST 1987, but two other
DeLand/Beresford boats as well:
ST 844, one of the last WW2
tugs; and ST 1978, the first of the
65 footers and one that was
100% completed at Lake
Beresford. How lucky is this? A
photo that shows 3 tugboats with
DeLand connections in the same
shot. ST 1978 ended up in
Vietnam; the fate of ST 844 is
unknown; ST 1987 came back
from Vietnam and was alive and
well in Canada in 2007.
